INSTRUMENTAL & VOCAL LESSONS

New applications for tuition starting in the **AUTUMN TERM 2019** should reach EMS by
Friday 7th June 2019

Enfield Music Service provides instrumental and vocal lessons to children and young people who live or go to school in the Borough of Enfield. Lessons are provided:-

- mostly in schools during school time
- at the EMS Tuesday evening Music Centre (at Highlands School, Worlds End Lane, N21 1QQ)
- at the EMS Saturday morning Music Centre (at Houndsfield School, Houndsfield Road, Edmonton, N9 7RA)

There are limited places for lessons on Tuesday evenings and Saturdays mornings but you can apply to put your child's name on a waiting list.

Lessons at school

Lessons can be given at your child's own school (*subject to available accommodation and there being sufficient pupils on your child's chosen instrument*). Most lessons take place during the normal school day and may be timetabled across curriculum time, lunch and break periods. Lessons, particularly in secondary schools, are often organised on a rota basis whereby the pupil has a different lesson time each week. Occasionally, with school and parental consent, instrumental lessons may take place just before or after the end of the school day.

An additional fee of £12.00 is payable for lessons outside school in the evenings and on Saturdays.				

The number of lessons given each term varies between 9 and 11, depending on the length of the school term. A registration document will be sent to you in advance of each term and will indicate the number of lessons to be given and the fee to be paid for that term.

****Free or subsidised lessons**

Free or subsidised lessons are only available if your child's school has agreed to fund lessons for pupils receiving Free School Meals and for pupils in local authority care or adopted children. Please check with your child's school before completing and returning the application form or contact the Enfield Music Service office for advice.

Free 'taster' lessons

Enfield Music Service can offer one term of free 'taster' lessons for **double bass**.
 The charge for instrument hire will still apply (**£37.00**).

Which instrument to choose

Enfield Music Service can provide lessons on the instruments listed in the table on the last page of this document. However, some schools may not be able to offer the full range of instruments due to accommodation restrictions and/or availability of suitable school resources. Some schools may restrict lessons to pupils in certain year groups. Please check with your child's school for details.

If we receive your form after this date, we cannot guarantee to provide lessons in the Autumn Term 2019.

If you wish us to acknowledge receipt of your postal application, please enclose a stamped self-addressed envelope.

HOW TO PAY

- You can pay in full or in two equal instalments. If you pay in two instalments, the first instalment is due by Friday 7th June 2019 and the balance must be paid by Friday 6th September 2019.
- By debit/credit card online at www.enfield.gov.uk. Select Enfield Music Service under the heading 'Make a payment', continue as a Guest and then choose 'Tuition and instrument hire' from the drop-down menu. When asked for a registration document no. insert **1000**. You must write the World Pay reference no. on the application form, the amount and the date you paid.
- By cheque (payable to *Enfield Council*). Send your cheque with the application form to the EMS office at the above address. Please write your child's name and school on the back of the cheque.
- Cash payments can only be made at Enfield Civic Centre, Silver Street, Enfield EN1 3XA. (The Cashiers Desk is open 10.00am-2.00pm.) You must send us a **copy** of your cash receipt with the application form.

HOW TO APPLY FOR FREE/SUBSIDISED LESSONS

If your child's school has agreed to fund or part fund lessons because your child receives Free School Meals (FSM), or is in local authority care, or adopted, you must attach to your application form:

- **a form or letter signed by the school confirming the school will fund the lessons**

Once lessons have been arranged, Enfield Music Service will issue a letter confirming your child's lessons. We will send a Practice Notebook for your child to take to his/her lessons which you can use to communicate with the instrumental tutor.

Notes and Conditions

- If we cannot provide the lessons or hire you have requested, we will return/refund any fees you have paid.
- If you cancel lessons (or hire) after we have assigned a tutor (or instrument) to your child but before the beginning of the Autumn Term 2019, we will deduct a £10.00 cancellation fee from any refund due to you. If you cancel lessons after the beginning of the Autumn Term 2019, any refund will be made at the discretion of Enfield Music Service.
- Enfield Music Service and/or the school will monitor the attendance and progress of pupils receiving free or subsidised lessons, and schools may withdraw funding for poor attendance or inadequate progress.
- Tutor absence -
If the instrumental tutor is absent and your child does not receive the number of lessons paid for that term, you will be reimbursed automatically after the end of the term.
- Pupil absence -
Pupils having individual lessons and all pupils in a group/pair
 - subject to the tutor being given **at least 3 weeks advanced notice of absence** (e.g. for school trip, exam, work experience etc) the tutor will try to re-organise the lesson. If the lesson cannot be made up then you will be reimbursed for the missed lesson. However, this does not apply to lessons at the EMS Saturday Centre or EMS Tuesday Centre where missed lessons cannot be refunded for any reason whatsoever.**Single pupil in a group/pair**
 - we regret that no refunds can be made if a single pupil from a group/pair is absent, for any reason whatsoever.

If 3 weeks advanced notice of absence has not been given, we regret no refund will be made for a missed lesson.

Providing an instrument

You will need to provide an instrument for your child's lessons and for practice at home.

(A pupil learning piano, keyboard, drum kit and double bass will have lessons on the instrument provided at the school, but should have access to their own piano, keyboard, drum kit (or practice pads) or hired double bass for practice at home.)

Instrument hire

Instruments available to hire from EMS are shown in the table above. The instrument hire fee is **£37.00** per term.

Assisted Instrument Purchase Scheme

If you intend to buy an instrument, you may be able to save the cost of VAT by purchasing the instrument through the AIP Scheme. The AIP Scheme is subject to certain conditions and details can be sent to you on request.

Learning a Musical Instrument



Dear Parents and Carers,

Children in Enfield schools have a wonderful opportunity to start learning to play a musical instrument. Instrumental/vocal lessons can be provided at nearly all schools in the borough.

Five good reasons to play an instrument and playing in an ensemble:

(1) it's fun (2) it helps build teamwork and social skills (3) it is really good for developing the brain (4) it increases concentration and focus (5) it can be a lifelong hobby and stress buster.

Which instrument can my child learn?

Lessons are available on almost any musical instrument including violin, viola, 'cello, double bass, drums, tabla/harmonium, flute, clarinet, oboe, bassoon, saxophone, recorder, guitar, trumpet, cornet, baritone, tenor horn, French horn, euphonium, trombone, tuba, keyboard, piano and voice (singing).

Who organises the lessons?

The lessons are arranged by **Enfield Music Service (EMS)**. EMS will try to organise a tutor to visit the school for any instrument as long as the school has enough children interested in learning to play it.

How much do the lessons cost?

Costs vary for group, paired and individual lessons and range from £67 - £174 (based on 10 lessons for the term) Details are available at www.enfield.gov.uk (search Enfield Music Service)

Can I apply for free lessons?

Students who are in receipt of Free School Meals, who are in Local Authority Care or who are adopted may be able to receive free or subsidised lessons subject to their school being willing to fund the lessons.

Do I have to buy the instrument?

You will need to provide an instrument for your child's lessons and for practice at home. You can hire some instruments from EMS (but not guitars, keyboards, pianos, recorders or drums)

Where and when are the lessons held?

Usually, the lessons take place in school. The EMS tutors arrange their timetable direct with the school and the school then tells pupils what day and time their lesson will be.

You can also apply for lessons at the EMS Saturday Music Centre (*based at Houndsfield School, Houndsfield Road, N9 7RA*) or for lessons at the EMS Tuesday Music Centre (*at Highlands School, Winchmore Hill, N21 1QQ*) but there may be a waiting list.

How do I apply for lessons?

We do hope this information has been helpful and that you will give serious thought to letting your child start to learn to play a musical instrument.
